What is ATAC?

ATAC is a group of motivated and enthusiastic teens between the ages of 13-17 who work together to imagine creative ways that they can make meaningful connections to art and to each other. Simply put, they are a group of fun, quirky, and creative teens!

What does ATAC do?

ATAC aims to encourage a culture of the arts amongst the local teen community by providing them access to world-class art and coaching, by encouraging teens to develop their skills as artists, and by giving those who are interested in the arts and humanities a head start on their careers through concrete volunteer experience and exposure to professionals in the museum. Past ATAC groups have organized art exhibitions and an open-mic night and even have produced a zine!

Are between the ages of 13 and 17
Are passionate about the creative arts
Are interested in working in a museum setting
Enjoy working with peers from diverse backgrounds
Are able to make a year-long commitment

Members will. . .

Serve as an advisory board by providing recommendations to staff about programs and services

Develop skills in arts administration (event planning, marketing, and career development) and arts advocacy (public speaking and leadership skills)

Learn about art, art history, and museum operations Have the opportunity to assist in summer programs

Be able to list ATAC as "community service" on applications and resumes

Be able to request a letter of recommendation from members of the Morris staff upon successful completion of the program
